Right There	Author and You
<p style="text-align: center;">I The Answer <u>IS</u> in the Text</p> <p style="text-align: center;">II The Answer is usually easy to find</p> <p style="text-align: center;">III The words used to make-up the question and the words used to answer the question are RIGHT THERE in the same sentence.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">I The answer <u>IS NOT</u> in the text</p> <p style="text-align: center;">II You need to think about what you already know; your own prior knowledge.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">III You need to think about what the author has told you in the text.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">IV Form your answer using II and III</p>

<p style="text-align: center;">I The answer <u>IS</u> in the text.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">II You need to put together different text parts to find it.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">III Words for the question and words for the answer are not the same and are <u>NOT IN THE SAME SENTENCE.</u></p> <p style="text-align: center;">IV You need to <u>THINK AND SEARCH</u> different words, phrases, sentences, and paragraphs for the answer.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">I The answer <u>IS NOT</u> in the text.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">II You could even answer the question without reading the selection.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">III You need to use your own experience and you own prior knowledge.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">IV Reading the text should add to your knowledge and help you answer the question.</p>
